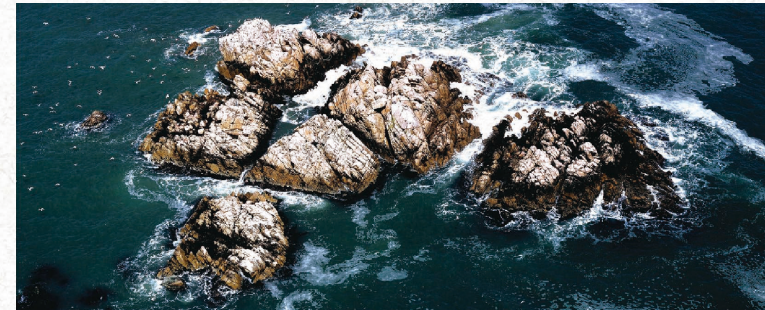

### Gameunsaji 사적 제31호

Gameunsaji is located on the East Coast. Gameunsa Temple was built during the Unified Silla period and has only two three-story stone pagodas and the remaining sites of Geumdang Hall and lecture halls. This temple was constructed under King Munmu who unified the Three Kingdoms and wanted to ward off Japanese invasions with the spirit of Buddha. He died before its completion, and his son, King Sinmun, took over the work that was finished in A.D. 682. According to Samguk Sagi (History of the Three Kingdoms), as he lay dying, King Munmu left a will stating that he be buried in the East Sea according to a Buddhist funeral to become a dragon and protect the country against the Japanese invaders. And then, his son named the temple out of gratitude to his father. A waterway is said to have been constructed under the temple toward the East Sea to enable the king-turned-dragon to enter the temple.
